






GROWTH OF DISCLOSURE TO CDP

Water security >3300 responders





Demand for environmental transparency in the supply chain is growing at record pace

NUMBER OF SUPPLIERS REQUESTES TO REPORT DATA TO CDP SUPPLY CHAIN PROGRAM (IN THOUSANDS)

growth in CDP Supply Chain members' request to suppliers to report their environmental data—the highest growth rate in 10 years resulting in a recordbreaking number of 23,487 supplier requests

However, the majority of companies are not actively engaging their suppliers on environmental topics

CDP Supply Chain members and 500+ companies on the Supplier Engagement Leaderboard are trailblazing a path for supplier engagement



Only 38%

of 11,000+ surveyed suppliers engage their suppliers on climate action, 16% on water security and 47% on deforestation

Especially on supply chain emissions, transparency must be increased


But it must be ensured that increased ambition will be translated into long-term action
